- 2. Register Section login and register your organization
- 3. Then go to Directory and click on to your page
- 4. Takes you to your presentation page go to Claim listing and add listing information
- 5. Then follow the prompts to fill in: personal information, contact information, geographical information
- 6. Then select respect forum (many choices drop down-pick as many as you work in
- 7. Fill in what you offer in services, methodologies, metrics, etc
- 8. Share with partners.
